The students are at the heart of everything that we do and at the heart of our educational approach are core values that guide our students towards becoming empathetic and effective leaders.

Our school has embraced the "Leader in Me" program, which is designed to foster leadership and life skills in students. This program is based on principles from "The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People" by Stephen Covey. The primary focus is for students to lead themselves well and then lead others. Through this programme, students learn to take responsibility, set goals, and develop habits that will serve them well throughout their lives.

One of the key aspects of the "Leader in Me" program is teaching students to demonstrate empathy. Empathy is a crucial skill that helps our students understand and respect others' perspectives and feelings. Our curriculum includes problem-solving tasks, project-based learning, Science and Mathematics activities that challenge students to think deeply and analytically. These activities help students develop the skills to analyze information, make reasoned decisions, and solve complex problems.
- Confident Communicators: We emphasize the development of strong communication skills through presentations, debates, and collaborative projects. Students are encouraged to express their ideas clearly and confidently, demonstrate empathy as they listen to others, and engage in constructive dialogue. This focus on communication equips them with the ability to articulate their thoughts effectively in various settings.
- **Civic Literacy**: Understanding civic responsibility and participation is an integral part of our educational program.
